



PNWJLA Scholarship Application Information

The number of scholarships and funds awarded will vary each year.

Members of 4-H/FFA who qualify may receive the scholarship only once.

Qualifications:

1. Applicant must be an active member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter in Clallam County.
2. Applicant must be entering or attending a school for post-secondary education (includes trade school) and must be enrolled within one year of receiving PNWJLA Scholarship.
3. No check will be issued directly to the recipient, all funds awarded will be mailed directly to the school noted on the application. School address and Student ID must be provided before check is issued.
4. Applicant must participate in the PNWJLA in the current year.
5. Applicant will be required to submit an original letter of recommendation from a 4-H leader or FFA advisor or member of the livestock industry. (The letter may not be from a family member)
6. Applications will be judged on:
 - a) Livestock participation/involvement
 - b) Leadership
 - c) Community service
7. Applications will be available on the PNWJLA website by January 15th of the current auction year.
8. Application must be postmarked by April 1st and mailed to the scholarship committee: PNWJLA, PO Box 3233, Port Angeles, WA 98362.
9. The decision of the Scholarship Committee will be final.
10. PNWJLA has the right to change or amend the scholarship application annually.
